

Inline Hockey World Championships of the IIHF (defunct)

In addition to the IIHF, the FIRS (Fédération Internationale de Roller Sports) also claim international responsibility for inline hockey. Although the IOC also considers the FIRS to be responsible for inline hockey, the sporting value of the IIHF World Championships was higher than that of the FIRS World Championships.

The rules at IIHF and FIRS also differ in some detail. At the IIHF, the rules are like ice hockey. Here are the main differences to ice hockey:

Playing time 4x12 min. Sudden death extra time maximum 5 min.

Players: 4 field players and a goalkeeper

Playing field: 2 halves

Offside: The player with the puck must enter the opponent's half before passing.

Penalties: small penalty of only 90 seconds, reduction to a minimum of 2 field players, body checks prohibited

In 2002 a new pointing system was introduced: game won without prolongation = 3 pts., game won after prolongation = 2 pts., game lost after prolongation = 1 pt., game lost without prolongation = 0 pts.

At the annual and extra ordinary congress on 23.-25.05.2019, the IIHF decided that they would no longer govern inline hockey or organize the Inline Hockey World Championships. The IIHF also cancelled the 2019 edition of the tournament due to a lack of applications for hosting the event.
